

Bishops Appoint Rev. Dr. Lillian Smith Conference Superintendent of the Altoona Area

Bishop Cynthia Moore-Koikoi and Bishop Steiner Ball have appointed a new Conference Superintendent effective July 1, 2024 to the Altoona District. Our new Superintendent brings a wealth of knowledge and a

commitment to effective ministry in the United Methodist Church with clergy, laity, and local churches.

The Rev. Dr. Lillian Smith has been appointed to the Altoona District. Dr. Smith has held positions throughout the General Church and in local churches. Since 2016, Lillian has been serving as pastor of Cheverly United Methodist Church, Cheverly, MD. Lillian has also served as Pastor at St. Matthew's UMC of Valley Forge, PA and as Lead Pastor at the historic Tindley Temple in Philadelphia, PA.

Lillian served as the Director, Connectional Ministries and Executive Director of Congregation Transformation with the Eastern PA Conference. While on staff, part of her portfolio was working with "High Potential Churches," "Large Church Initiative" and "Next Level Ministries."

Lillian has served as Associate General Secretary, Division on Ministries with Young People with the General Board of Discipleship. She also held the position of Director, Ministries with Women and Persons of Color with the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry.

Lillian is the author of Words to Live By: Wisdom Keys that Can Change Your Life. She recently contributed a chapter to the book: I'm Black, I'm Christian, I'm Methodist. Her most recent book is Rooted Again: Re-Establishing Forgotten or Abandoned connections with God and God's Kingdom Mandate.

She received her Master of Divinity from Wesley Theological Seminary and her Doctor of Ministry from United Theological Seminary. Lillian will be on loan to the Susquehanna Conference from the Baltimore-Washington Conference.

NEJ REDUCES EPISCOPAL AREAS TO SIX

Northeastern Jurisdictional Conference reduced its episcopal areas from nine to six, after hearing an extensive report and approving a motion from its Committee on Episcopacy. In the new configuration, eight annual conferences will each share a bishop and two conferences will each have one bishop (with West Virginia sharing a Bishop with the SEJ). The decision was affirmed by a 123 to 19 vote. The new episcopal areas, comprise these conferences:


- Baltimore-Washington and Peninsula-Delaware
- · Eastern Pennsylvania and Greater New Jersey
- · New York and New England
- Susquehanna and Upper New York
- · Western Pennsylvania
- West Virginia (this area will share a Bishop with a conference from the Southeastern Jurisdiction – it will be the Holston Conference in Tennessee)

Since 2022, the Baltimore-Washington and Peninsula-Delaware Conferences have shared a bishop, and Eastern Pennsylvania and Greater New Jersey have also shared a bishop. Meanwhile, supervision of the Susquehanna Conference has been shared by the bishops of the Western Pennsylvania and West Virginia conferences. Currently, the jurisdiction is served by seven bishops, including Bishop John Schol, who retires at this conference, and Bishop Peggy Johnson, who will return to retirement status.

Those retirements leave five active bishops. The 2024 General Conference voted in May to apportion six bishops to the Northeastern Jurisdiction and varying numbers of bishops to the other four jurisdictions, approving a recommendation from the UMC's Interjurisdictional Episcopacy Committee.

General Conference also allowed jurisdictions to assign active bishops who are willing to transfer across jurisdictional lines. While no current bishops were able or willing to transfer, the NEJ agreed to share a bishop with the Southeastern Jurisdiction.

The NEJ Committee on Episcopacy, led by Judi Kenaston, worked many hours before and during the Jurisdictional Conference, aided by research and recommendations by the NEJ Boundaries Committee, to configure the new episcopal areas for the 2024–2028 quadrennium. They also explored possible adjustments if the 2028 General Conference requires the NEJ and other jurisdictions to further reduce their number of episcopal areas due to financial and missional reasons.





Bishop Burgos-Núñez will be assigned to the Susquehanna Conference UMC

Bishop Héctor Antonio Burgos-Núñez will be assigned to the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church starting September 1, 2024.

He will be shared with the Upper New York Annual Conference as part of the new episcopal area configuration.

Bishop Héctor A. Burgos-Núñez was elected to the episcopacy by the Northeastern Jurisdictional Conference on November 4, 2022. He is the first Hispanic-Latino bishop in the Northeastern Jurisdiction.

Bishop Héctor A. Burgos-Núñez holds an M.Div. from the School of Theology at Drew University in Madison, NJ, a bachelor's in business administration with a concentration in Management and Strategic Marketing from the University of Puerto Rico, and a graduate certificate in Information Systems Technology. At the time of his election to the episcopacy, Bishop Burgos served as District Superintendent of the Central District of the Greater New Jersey Conference.

Bishop Burgos-Núñez served pastorates at West Creek United Methodist Church 2004-2005, First United Methodist Church, Iglesia Casa de Esperanza 2005-2009, and Oasis United Methodist Church 2009-2014. He also served as Director of Worship and Urban Ministries 2014, Executive Director of NextGen Ministries of GNJ 2016-2018, and Director of Connectional Ministries 2015-2019 for the Greater New Jersey Conference.
